PERFECT PEOPLE AS A PURPOSE OF HOLISTIC EDUCATION IN ISLAM (PART 1)



The term **holistic** education has become a movement which began in the mid-1980 in North America as it is an idea of developing a person's intellectual, emotional, social, physical, artistic, creative and spiritual **potentials** (Ron Miller). However, if we can **trace back** that this term of holistic education was **originated** from Islam. As **quoted** from Al-Qur'an Al-Ahzab verse 21: "**Verily** there is in (the self) the Messenger of Allah as a good example for you (that is) for those who wish (mercy) Allah and the (coming) of judgment day and he mentions God a lot. The Prophet Muhammad was sent by Allah to perfect and improve the morals of mankind as well as a good example.

Furthermore, as it also is recited from the Holy Qur'an in At Tin verse 4 says that human beings are created by Allah as the best creature. This is a fact that humans are better than all God's creations: animals, plants, and others. Humans have got perfect physic as well as mental. Nonetheless, we must be reminded that all God's gifts to humans can also be disastrous if we **misuse** God's gift. As a result, humans can become lower than animals.

However, for those who have good faith in Allah and His Messenger, Nabi Muhammad Saw, will try their **effort** in order to **maintain** good and **noble deeds**. Islam has taught us to value or see things based on Al Qur'an and Hadits, or noble deed as exemplified by the Prophet Muhammad Saw. These values are put first to teach humans, especially students, to become true followers of Islam who share peace to the universe or *rahmatan lil alamin*. Therefore, to implement these, knowledge of religion as well as general knowledge must share the same purpose in order to create **the-so-called** in Islam, *insan kamil*, or human beings who achieve wholeness or balance within physical and spiritual beings.
